

Richard became involved with the AREQ around the 2000s.


From early on, he was a member of the West Island Sector Council and held various positions.

He was the initiator of the first newspaper in the West Island sector, Le Vent d'Ouest. A born organizer, he has several Bowl-a-Thons to his credit. His goal is to raise money for the FLG (Laure-Gaudreault Foundation) which will be distributed to various charities in the Montreal area.

At the annual meeting of this foundation his presence has always been undeniable.

In 2015, as president of the West Island sector, he was quick to agree to consolidate with the Lachine sector. His commitment led to the formation of the sector Du-Haut de-l'Isle of about 900 members.

This planning was done in harmony with the Lachine sector.





Our Elder of the Year: Carmen Dumont

While Americans were celebrating their Independence Day in 1944, Carmen was born in Sudbury, Ontario! On July 4, she was the 7th of a modest family of 9 children.


An uneventful childhood and adolescence led her to Sudbury Normal School (specialization in special education) to become a teacher. A dream she realized in 1964 where she taught in 1st, 2nd and 6th grades alternately for 11 years.

A combination of circumstances brought her to Quebec in 1976, to the Baldwin-Cartier School Board, where she began as a substitute teacher (mainly in special education) from January to June '77.

In September 1977 she was hired as a remedial teacher at the Marguerite-Bourgeois School in Pointe-Claire for 2 years.

In 1979, she changed schools and the Jacques-Bizard school had the honor of benefiting from her skills for 3 years.

In 1982 she returned to Sudbury only to return the following year to Jacques-Bizard where her talents and dedication led her to do team-teaching, homeschooling and family support as a remedial teacher, a job she held for 8 years.


In 1991, following the death of her mother and father within a day of each other, Carmen began a one-year training in palliative care after which she returned to Quebec, still at Jacques-Bizard School where she retired in 2004.

We don't know Carmen if we think that her dedication would stop there.

From 2008 to 2023 (15 years) she generously gave her time and energy to the AREQ as both 1st and 2nd vice-president of the sector council, first to the West Island and then to the Haut-de-l'Isle sector. She tirelessly gives her time to organize the various sector dinners (reservations, decorations, etc.). Carmen does not calculate how much time or energy she spends to enhance the activities of the sector. She has served under 3 different presidents (Luc Brunet, Michel Lanctôt and Richard Raymond).

Carmen, know that your presence has always been appreciated; it is in your honour that I speak on behalf of the Sector Council to award you the title of Elder of the Year for 2023-2024 of the Du-Haut-de-l'Isle sector!









Insurances News

Recently, I received two emails from our regional manager. They included two topics that will have an impact, first on our pharmacy bills and then on the procedure for claiming our medical expenses for reimbursement.

The first topic:

As of July 1, 2023, there is an increase in rates at the Public Prescription Drug Insurance Plan. Our pharmacy bill will therefore be affected. To see the details of these changes, we invite you to visit the Protegez-vous site which is in French only; there is a simple text, followed by a specific example, to help us understand these calculations.



The second topic is that since June 19, beneva.ca has replaced the SSQ.CA

Indeed, for almost 2 years since this change was announced, very little has changed. For the customer like you and me, the only change is that you must contact the beneva.ca site for your claims. The rest will be very easy, because you will use the same username and password. Your username is your email address. If you have forgotten your password, you can request a password reset. Once the connection is established, the procedure remains the same as it was with SSQ Insurance.


For people who use phone or tablet, the Beneva app is available for download.

In the September 2022 edition of Échos de l'Ile, I wrote that "If the trend of recent years continues, we will be 150 participants and raise \$5,000 in 2023"


Quite honestly it was almost a dream, at least a wish. Some even candidly confessed to me that "the bar was high".

Today, I am particularly proud to announce that the members of AREQ Montreal and their friends have made this dream a reality.

On June 11, 179 participants raised \$5,035. That's 76 more people and \$1860 more donated to the FLG regional collection than the previous year.

The good mood and solidarity felt during the three hours of the activity made the participants leave with the intention of returning with friends. So let me dream again: why can't we reach a participation of 252 people (the maximum of the hall) who would raise \$ 7,000? Nothing is impossible! Stay tuned for information .

I would like to thank all the volunteers who helped me in the preparation and execution of this wonderful activity. Without these people the task would have been gigantic if not impossible. And I want to thank everyone involved; without you, there would have been nothing and the Laure-Gaudreault Foundation would have been the big loser.


